# FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TRICIA SULLIVAN

Seeds of Hope (SOH) is excited to share the incredible results of an Alumni Survey conducted this past year. We are launching our "great news" within the pages of this newsletter, and we believe you will be as excited as we are when you explore the data.

The survey data is a reflection of the outstanding quality education and spiritual development that the Archdiocese of Denver K-8 Catholic schools provide within our community. These amazing results are made possible because of Seeds of Hope's generous community of donors who assist in helping to provide scholarships to children whose families can't afford a Catholic education.

We will be sharing all of the outstanding data we received with you, but want to highlight two statistics in particular:

#### **High School Grade Point Average**

SOH students are well prepared for high school, and the proof is from a GPA comparison: SOH Alumni GPA average is 3.51 vs. 2.69 for low-income families in public schools. Statistics show that a student's high school GPA is an indicator of their future success.

#### The Tolerance of Different Opinions

SOH young adults display a greater state of emotional health than their peers and are extremely accepting of opinions that differ from their own. SOH alumni have a significantly higher tolerance score at 77.17% in college and 92.83% in the workplace. These numbers are compared to only 58% for Colorado young adults. Tolerance is defined as the willingness to accept behavior and beliefs that are different from your own, although you might not agree with or approve of them. In today's climate, this result gives us hope for a future generation of children and adults who can work through differences and come to accept and understand one another.

One of our main goals for 2023 is to focus on showing our donors the impact you are having on the lives of God's children. Through testimonies of current students and SOH alumni, your gift is forever changing the trajectory of these children's lives.



As you can see from these heartfelt testimonies, our Catholic schools are providing a future full of hope. The number one reason that children cannot attend a Catholic school is because of the cost. Our donors make a difference by helping those that can't afford Catholic education. With the increase of students in need of financial assistance, our community and donor support are essential.

At Seeds of Hope, we believe that children need Catholic education now more than ever. Seeds of Hope provides tuition assistance to low-income families who otherwise could not afford it. The median income for our families is \$46,727. This is for a family of 5. On average families spend \$1,900 per child to send their children to an Archdiocese of Denver K-8 Catholic school. Parents make large sacrifices to make this possible.

We like to partner with these families because we believe that education is something that these students will have forever. Education is the great equalizer, opening the doors to a lifetime of opportunities for future generations.

# HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE LAST 18 MONTHS:

#### **#1: COMMUNITY AND DONOR SUPPORT:**

The Golf for Hope tournament and Evening of Hope gala resulted in record breaking results. Thank you to all of our inspirational donors who believe in Catholic schools and continue to support our mission.

#### **#2: EXPANDED OUR REACH:**

We reached more students this year than ever before—approximately 1,200; an increase of 15% from last year with over \$2.25M in Hope Scholarships awarded.

#### **#3: ESTABLISHMENT OF WOMEN OF HOPE:**

We created an amazing women's group (Women of Hope) that has monthly speakers who focus on defending our faith and Catholic education. We have over 40 members and invite all women to join us.

#### **#4: CLASSROOM IMPACT GRANTS:**

We provided \$440,000 in a pilot "Mission Renewal/Classroom Impact Grant Program". These competitive one-time block grants were open to all 35 K-12 Archdiocese of Denver schools. These grants focused on strengthening schools by supporting teacher education and certification, providing textbooks, and other items that had a great impact in areas where our schools needed it most.

#### **#5: ARC VOUCHERS:**

We partnered with *arc* Thrift Stores to distribute vouchers to low-income families in our schools to buy new outfits, shoes, and school supplies.
